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## Intelligent Design (ID)

A limited theory that believes in a designer without identifying the designer. Adherents of this view can be YEC, OEC, and occasionally EC or those who are non-committal on creation theories. Can believe in evolution, but has scientific-like arguments against non-miraculous evolution. Is not directly connected with the belief in a Christian God, although many adherents are Christian.
